*ASB is not defined as 'crime' however it has been included in this table for your information as it can affect the wider community and we (police) are jointly responsible with local councils for dealing with it. Recordable ASB includes neighbour disputes, noise nuisance and fly tipping etc.

The figure now provided includes all ASB – environmental, nuisance and personal.

Please note that there has been a change in the way burglary offences are recorded nationally. They are now classified as:

Burglary Residential – all buildings within the boundaries of a property, including sheds and garages

Burglary Business and Community – buildings that are solely for business purposes or are otherwise outside the classification of residential burglary, such as a sports club or place of worship.

Other News and events

Sadly this month I had to attend an incident in which a large number of sheep and lambs were killed by dogs. The matter is currently under investigation, but I would like to remind all dog owners to always put your animals on a lead when around livestock. Livestock worrying is an offence and could result in the destruction of your dog. Please don't let this happen to you.

Spring has finally arrived and with the warmer weather now with us, just a gentle reminder about the vulnerability in rural areas of outbuilding, shed and garages which are often used to store items such as gardening equipment, power tools and bikes of significant value. By taking simple precautions, the risk of burglary can be greatly reduced. Use strong padlocks and ensure valuable items are security marked and photographed which help with recovery if stolen and recovered.

If you are busy in your garden don't forget to lock away your gardening equipment after use as would be thieves will often use items they find at a property rather than risk being caught carrying their own tools.
